Special Remarks on Chronic Effects on Humans Ingestion of iodides by pregnant women should be avoided. Iodides readily diffuse across the placenta. Neonatal deaths from respiratory distress secondary to goiter and fetal complications such as cretinism have been reported.

Special Remarks on other Toxic Effects on Humans
Acute Potential Health Effects:
Skin: May cause skin irritation.
Eyes: May cause eye irritation.
Inhalation: May cause respiratory tract irritation.
Ingestion: Ingestion of iodides may cause vomiting, and abdominal pain, but do not result in caustic effects on the gastrointestinal tract. Other symptoms may include metallic taste, parotitis, and an increase in salivary and bronchial secretions. Ingestion of iodides may also cause hypersensitivity reactions which may present as antioedema, arthralgia, eosinophilia, lymphadenitis, or urticaria.
Chronic Potential Health Effects:
Ingestion: Prolonged or repeated ingestion of iodides may cause iodism. Iodism is characterized by salivation, unpleasant metallic taste, burning sensation in the mouth and throat, soreness in the teeth and gums, skin lesions or other skin eruptions, enlarged or tender salivary glands, coryza, sneezing, rhinorrhea, productive cough, diarrhea, gastric irritation, depression, conjunctivitis, headache, fever, laryngitis, bronchitis, stomatitis, and various skin rashes. It may also cause hypothyroidism and goiter.

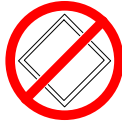
