Ingestion of large doses can cause gastroenteritis, abdominal pain, vomiting, diarrhea. The toxicity of nitrates is due to the in vivo conversion to nitrites. The primary toxic effects of nitrites include orthostatic hypotension(due to peripheral vasodilation) and methemoglobinemia (the formation of methemoglobin in the blood which causes deficient oxygenation of the blood due to decreased

availability of hemoglobin). Other symptoms may include chocolate-brown colored

blood, muscular weakness, flushing, sweating, syncope, dizziness,

lightheadedness, fatigue, throbbing headache, mental impairment, ataxia, incoordination, seizures/convulsions, bradycardia or tachycardia (slow or fast

heartbeat), dysrythmias, dyspnea (shortness of breath and dificulty

breathing). Furthermore, methemoglobinemia due to inadequate oxygenation of the blood can lead to progessive cyanosis, and coma, and possible death. Cyanosis is first visible as a bluish discoloration of the mucous membranes and unpigmented areas of the body. May cause blurred or foggy vision. It may cause

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twitching or tremors/trembling. May affect behavior/central nervous system

(confusion).

Chronic Toxicity Chronic ingestion of lithium or lithium compounds can cause kidney damage,

gastrointestional disturbances, dehydration, loss of appetite, weight loss, and dermatological effects. It may also affect the thyroid (goiter, hypothyroidism), the blood (leukocytosis), heart function, central nervous system (see acute ingestion). Chronic ingestion of Lithium Nitrate may affect the blood (normocytic anemia,

changes in white blood cell count), and may cause hyperglycemia.
