### 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

Prevention of secondary hazards:

Prevent product from entering drains. Absorb spilled material in dry sand or inert absorbent before recovering it into an airtight container. In case of large amount of spillage, contain a spill by bunding. Adhered or collected material should be promptly disposed of, in accordance with appropriate laws and regulations.

Do not allow contact with water. Remove all sources of ignition. Fire-extinguishing devices should be prepared in case of a fire. Use spark-proof tools and explosion-proof equipment. Since there is a possibility of igniting behind when removal of a leakage thing is imperfect, it is careful enough.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE
